## <u>Setting up your New Aquarium</u>

The most important thing to consider when setting an aquarium up is that you are creating a suitable environment for organisms to live in. To do this, you need to fill the aquarium with water. Tap water contains chlorine and chloramine which needs to be removed. For this, a de-chlorinator can be used. Next, bacteria must be added to kickstart the filtration process. Over the course of the next two weeks your water parameters will go through some changes. Specifically the Ammonia, Nitrite, Nitrate and pH. The water quality must be tested to ensure the aquarium has been fully cycled. A water quality test kit will advise you on what levels of each parameter is best for your chosen species of fish.

#### **Adding Fish to your Aquarium**

Once you're all set, you can begin to add fish to your aquarium. To ensure that your filter does not become overwhelmed, you must take your time when adding new fish to a recently established aquarium. The thing to consider is that every fish produces waste, the more fish added means more waste produced. The best practice is to stock fish in groups of five at a time.
