

UK National Cadet Class Association Notice of Race for the

Cadet National and Open Championship 2016

WPNSA, Weymouth & Portland

Monday 22nd - Friday 26th August 2016



1. Rules

- 1.1 Racing will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the Class Rules of the International Cadet Class (including the Equipment Rule of Sailing 2013-2016 ("the ERS") where referred to), the current UKNCCA Standing Sailing Instructions (CCSSI), the Event Sailing Instructions (ESI) and this Notice of Race (NOR)
- **1.2** The Class Rules of the International Cadet Class are on the International Cadet Class Association website (www.cadetclass.org), or on the UKNCCA website <a href=(www.cadetclass.org.uk).

The ERS are available on the ISAF website (www.ifds.org).

The CCSSI and the Courses Appendix will be available on the UKNCCA website (www.cadetclass.org.uk) and a set will be posted on the Event Notice Board at the event.

The ESI will be posted on the Event Notice Board at the event, and may also be available on the UKNCCA website (www.cadetclass.org.uk).

2. Advertising

2.1. Any decals provided by the Organizing Authority must be displayed as provided in ISAF Regulation 20.

3. Eligibility and Entry

- **3.1.** The regatta is open to all boats where both helm and crew are members of a National Cadet Class Association affiliated to the International Cadet Class Association.
- 3.2. Helms and crews must be aged 17 or under on 31st December in the year of the event.
- 3.3. Entry shall be made via the "2016 Nationals" tab on the UK Cadet Class Website (www.cadetclass.org.uk).
- **3.4.** Attention is also drawn to CCSSI 22 as to the activities of support boats and personnel and the possible sanctions for infringement of that rule.

4. Classification

4.1. Entries will be divided into Gold, Silver and Bronze fleets in accordance with the UKNCCA protocol in that regard a copy of which is set out in the Appendix to this NOR

5. Payment

- **5.1.** Payment for entering is online. It is a requirement that the correct bank reference is used. This will be **NAT/16000 for the National Championship** (16000 being the membership ID number). If you do not have a membership number you must obtain one by joining the class association before the event.
- **5.2.** Online entries close at midnight on the 15th of August 2016. Entries will be accepted at registration on the day of the event with cash payment.
- **5.3.** The entry fee is £175.
- **5.**4. Entries for Bronze fleet only will be available for a daily rate of £35 if not attending the entire event.

6. Schedule

6.1. Registration

6.1.1. All helms and crews must register at the Event. Registration will be open on Monday 22nd August between 09.00 hrs and 12.00 hours at the Cadet Class office located on the 1st Floor of the Event Hall in the Academy building.

6.2. Dates and Times of Racing

- **6.2.1.** There will be a briefing for all competitors at 12.00 on Monday 22nd August in the Event Hall at the Weymouth & Portland National Sailing Academy.
- **6.2.2.** Ten races are scheduled of which three constitute a series, **Race Schedule TBC** and may be subject to change depending on conditions.
- **6.2.3.** It is likely that all races during a day will be held back to back without time to go ashore in between races.
- **6.2.4.** Not more than four races will be sailed in one day.
- **6.2.5.**The Race Committee may re-schedule any postponed or abandoned races on any day as per CCSSI 5.2 and may bring forward races as per CCSSI 5.3.
- **6.2.6.** No warning signal will be made after 16:00 on the last day of the regatta.
- **6.2.7.** The Gold and Silver Fleets will usually sail together. The Bronze Fleet will usually sail on the same course as the Gold and Silver fleets, but will start after them and will be scored separately. At its discretion the Race Committee may combine the Bronze Fleet with the Silver Fleet.

7. Measurement

- **7.1.** A valid measurement certificate for the boat complete with current buoyancy endorsements shall be produced at registration.
- 7.2. Where a valid measurement certificate is not produced, RRS 78.2 is amended as follows:
 - **7.2.1.** A statement shall be signed by the competitor and his or her parent or guardian.
 - **7.2.2.** A certificate shall be submitted to the Race Organising Committee not later than 12:00 on the last day of the event.
 - 7.2.3. A fee of £10 will be payable.

7.3. Equipment Inspection

Equipment may be inspected to check that it complies with the Cadet Class rules both prior to and during the event. All boats will be weighed and sailors will present a maximum of 1 set of sails intended to be used during the event to measurement control which will be open 14:30 - 17:00 on Sunday 21st August and 09:30-11.00 Monday 22nd August and other times at the discretion of the Equipment Inspector for the Event if required.

- **7.4.** For this process competitors will be inspected on a first come first served basis at the measurement checkpoint. Competitors should ensure that sails have been certified by a measurer or have been subject to in-house certification and carry an ICC label or button as per Rule G2.2 and G2.3
- **7.5.** It is intended that at least the first three boats in each race and up to three selected at random from the fleet (including their spars, sails and equipment and that of their helms and crews) shall be inspected, weighed and/or measured in such respects as the Equipment Inspector for the event in his discretion shall think fit.

8. Sailing Instructions

8.1. A limited number of sailing instructions will be available at registration. Competitors are encouraged to print their own from the Event Entry website.

9. Venue

9.1. The race course will be in Portland Harbour or in Weymouth Bay.

10. Courses

10 The courses are shown in the UKNCCA Courses Appendix.

11. Scoring

11.1 The scoring system shall be in accordance with the CCSSI's.

12. Prizes

- **12.1.** Prizes will be awarded to (i) to at least the first six helms and crews overall in the combined Gold and Silver fleet; (ii) to the first three helms and crews in the Silver fleet; and (iii) to the first three boats in the Bronze fleet. Prizes may also be awarded in various other categories.
- **12.2.** The first British helm and crew overall in the combined Gold and Silver Fleet will be the 2016 UK Cadet National Champions.

13. Risk Statement

Rule 4 of the racing rules of sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore:
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions:
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, can be practically provided in the circumstances;

13.1. Inspection

The fact that the race committee conducts inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this Notice of Race.

13. Insurance

13.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £2,000,000 (two million pounds).

14. WPNSA Variations

- **14.1** Competitors shall comply with the rules of the Academy whilst on site.
- **14.2** Adequate personal buoyancy must be worn at all times by all crews while afloat. Neither a wetsuit or drysuit constitutes personal buoyancy.

3. Allocation of Bronze Fleet

The Bronze fleet shall consist of all other entrants.

4. Application by the helm to be considered for another fleet to that allocated

Any helm who qualifies for either the Silver Fleet or Bronze fleet, may apply to be placed in another higher ranked fleet. Such application will be assessed on the basis of the applicant's age, past results & sailing ability. Application must be made by letter stating age, past results and reasons for application. The application must be supported by a letter from applicant's Squadron Captain or other person suitably qualified to assess the applicant's sailing ability and suitability for a higher ranked fleet.

The applicant's letter and the supporting letter may be in hard copy or email form, but either must be received by the UKNCCA Chairman no later than Sunday 31st March.

Additionally sailors from the Junior Development Squad for whom these are their first UKNCCA events may apply to be in the Bronze fleet.

If an applicant is only entering say one event in the year e.g. The Nationals then the right to apply is extended up to and including the 14th day prior to the start date of that event. The UKNCCA Committee will, at its discretion, appoint a panel of 3 persons to assess the application and its decision will be final.

5. Allocation to a different fleet by the UKNCCA Committee

Notwithstanding the foregoing the UKNCCA Committee appointed panel may allocate a boat to a different fleet if it considers that fleet is more suitable for the boat concerned having regard to the results, age or ability of the helm and/or the crew, but such an allocation will not be made without the consent of the helm of the boat concerned.

6. Boats entered in the wrong fleet for an event

Any Helm/boat found to knowingly be entered and sailing in the wrong fleet under this system should advise the UKNCCA Chair immediately. Failure to notify the UKNCCA of your placement into the wrong fleet can carry the maximum penalty of disqualification for that race or races completed in the series whilst entered in the wrong fleet.

7. Sailors from other Classes

Sailors from other classes will be allocated to fleets by the UKNCCA Committee appointed panel having regard to the results, age or ability of the helm and/or the crew, but such an allocation will not be made without the consent of the helm of the boat concerned.
