Netting Permit Byelaw

The Netting Permit Byelaw has been confirmed by Defra and will come into force on 1st March 2018. All commercial and recreational fishers who wish to use nets in the D&S IFCA District will need to get a permit.

Application forms are now available and can be requested or collected from the office of D&S IFCA. An option for on-line permit applications and payment is expected to be available be soon.
