

SEA FISHERIES REGULATION ACT 1966

SW1 PROHIBITION OF NETS

(River Camel and River Fowey)

No net shall be used during the months of May to December inclusive for taking fish in any tidal waters inshore of the closing lines specified herein:

- 1. A line drawn across the River Camel, from the westernmost extremity of Trebetherick Point to the seaward extremity of Stepper Point.
- 2. A line drawn across the River Fowey, from the southernmost extremity of St. Catharine's Point to the highest point of Punch Cross Rocks, thence to the nearest point on the mainland.

Provided that this Byelaw shall not prohibit the use of:

- a) fyke nets for taking eels, licensed by the Environment Agency;
- b) seine or drift nets for taking salmon or sea trout, licensed by the Environment Agency;
- c) seine nets with a mesh no greater than 20 millimetres knot to knot stretched for taking sand eels with the prior permission in writing from the Environment Agency; or
- d) landing nets used in conjunction with rod and line.
