CHAIR & VICE-CHAIR OF HWRA

SELECTION OF CANDIDATE FOR LOCAL ELECTIONS

In 2016, all-out elections were held for Elmbridge Borough Council under new ward boundaries. All three positions in the new Hinchley Wood and Weston Green Ward were successfully held by residents candidates, sponsored jointly by HWRA and Thames Ditton and Weston Green Residents' Association (TD&WGRA). As part of the process of returning to election by thirds, the seat currently held by Nigel Haig-Brown falls to be contested this year. Nigel has indicated that he would be willing to stand again, and has received the endorsement of TD&WGRA for this. But it remains open for others to put their names forward for consideration by the AGM if they wish to do so.

CRIME

There has been a worrying increase in local crime recently, with total recorded crime in the Dittons and Hinchley Wood up by 32% from January to November 2017 compared with the same period in 2016. Across the Borough there was a marked increase in the number of burglaries in the second half of 2017.

There have been disturbing incidents of thefts of and from vehicles parked on driveways. In some cases vehicles have been left unlocked, and we urge all residents to lock their vehicles at all times, even if left only for a short time. In other cases, electronic devices appear to have been used to gain access, and the police are urging residents to take additional precautions to guard against this kind of attack.



The switching off of street lighting in the small hours is felt by many to have contributed to the rise in this type of crime. Residents may wish to consider installing security lighting to mitigate the effects.

On a happier note, the police have reported a number of significant arrests and recoveries of stolen property.

HEATHROW EXPANSION CONSULTATION

Heathrow has launched a public consultation on the emerging proposals to enable the expansion of the airport, as well as the principles of the airspace design that will be required.

This consultation - separate to the Government's Airports National Policy Statement consultation - will run for 10 weeks until 28 March 2018.
