

Financial Assistance – Helping Us to Help You

If you have financial difficulties and are struggling to keep the lights on and food on the table, we are here to help. But **before** contacting Fishermen's Mission make sure that you have:

- Applied for Universal Credit if you are not working.
- Contacted your mortgage provider or landlord to seek a 'holiday' or temporary reduction in monthly payments.
- Spoken to your local Council if you have Council Tax arrears.
