




Flu Vaccination

SSSC New Codes of Practice



I am pleased to tell you that the SSSC have published the revised SSSC Codes of Practice for Social Service Workers and Employers. They apply from 1 November 2016. They were updated to reflect the many changes to social service policy and practice since they were first published in 2003.

The changes in the Codes also include changes to how they regulate, which also starts on 1 November. The new approach, known as fitness to practise, means that when concerns are raised about a worker they look at whether they are fit to practise rather than whether we can prove misconduct.
