

Some Valuation Sources

This is a list of some of the sources I use to find valuations for Cost Benefit Analysis (CBA) and Social Return on Investment (SROI). It is certainly not a complete list; there are a wealth of other sources, and these often change or are added to. I will try to update this basic list regularly though, so please let me know if you find any dead links or good sources that I've missed!

It is important to use any valuation in the right context. Understanding what changes and why is vital before any of these valuations are applied in practice.

NB: Some of these sources have licensing requirements. Please check the documentation for details.
