Dear Families

Firstly, I would like to apologise about the closure of the school on Thursday, 1st July. I **never** make such decisions lightly as I know every day of education is so important for our children. However, many of you will have seen that the water pipe burst AGAIN just outside school. Therefore, the water pressure was extremely low. By 7.30am some of the toilets were already failing to flush. COVID-19 safety measures make having water even more vital as we have to ensure children wash their hands regularly. It was impossible to guarantee we would have enough water to keep everyone safe. I am corresponding with Haringey council to lobby Thames Water, to ensure that this situation does not happen again. But... our *plastic ducks got to enjoy the river*! Your child may have told you that they have been doing tests over the last few weeks. It has been great watching them trying their best - that's all we ask of them, to stay INCREDIBLE learners. Please continue to give them as much encouragement with their learning as you can. Praise their efforts, as this is more important than the actual scores they achieve. Praise will help to build their confidence and self-esteem, which in turn will encourage them to try even harder, and that's what brings progress and success.

Did you know... Interesting facts about the school

- The current building took three years to create.
- It was officially **opened on 21 July 2014.**
- There is an **underground reservoir** that stores rainwater to be re-used in the school toilets.
- A grass roof on the school attracts vital bees and other wildlife to the area.
- The **windows open and close by themselves** to regulate the temperature in school.
- The building was designed so that at **lunchtime, the hall floors are lit with pink and yellow lighting** from the sun.
- The school is **unique** in that we have a **purpose built environment** for a special primary, mainstream primary and children's centre which all form the **Broadwater's Inclusive Learning Community** (BILC)
- There is **one governing body** for all three parts of BILC
- We have an **outdoor classroom** growing space **and** a **forest** area

Founded in 1928, the London Taxi Drivers charity for children has assisted many special needs and vulnerable children. The charity is renowned for the taxi outings, taking hundreds of children to the seaside (including the Willow). A firm favourite is the annual Mad Hatters party at the Grosvenor House, Park Lane, London which we usually attend. Unfortunately, due to the covid 19 pandemic, the party was cancelled this year. Chairman Michael Son BEM came up with the brilliant idea of a competition to find the best mad hatters hat made by London's schoolchildren.

The second prize was Frank in Rabbit class, who received a £150 cheque prize!



Our school lunches are prepared daily by a team of eleven staff. Together they make 750+ meals for children and staff, using fresh ingredients.



For children in years 3,4,5 & 6, the cost is £2.20 per day, £11 per week.









What does a school lunch comprise of? Hot meat/vegetarian option (or vegetarian only ie pizza), hot vegetables, hot carbohydrate (rice, potatoes, pasta). They children can choose from the salad bar (7-8 options), some fruit/yoghurt for dessert, or an occasional pudding such as cake/biscuit/ice cream.

Lunchtime

The government pays for children in Reception, years 1 and 2 to get a free lunch.

Heritage Day @ The Willow Primary School

At the Willow Primary School we are very proud of the diversity of our staff and pupils! This year we are introducing a *Heritage day* (which will expand to a Heritage week next year). *Heritage day* gives us all an opportunity to research and celebrate our own, and others' heritages. Each year, we will choose an aspect of our heritage to explore and learn about.

Year 5's visit to Into University (by Luis Ciku)

What we learnt

On the 25th and 26tth May 2021, Year 5 went to Into University, a place where children are inspired to think about going to university when they're older. Year 6 went there in Year 5 and now it was our turn. We were learning about Zoology. We learnt a lot about animals and habitats. Outside the Year 5 middle area, we put up posters about endangered animal species to showcase our learning. For example, did you know? It's really sad that there are only 3000 tigers left in the WHOLE WORLD!!!

Playground

At lunch-time, we went to the park, which is right in front of the building. It was MAGNIFICENT!!!! Lots of children hogged the swings; some had a race to get to the top of the huge rope climbing frame; and some were hanging out on the wooden climbing frame. It also had a see-saw and a slide.

In the afternoon, we were on a Zoom call with a lady called Georgie. She had a lot of reptiles. We learned about tarantulas, stick insects, cockroaches and tree frogs. Some of the suggested areas for improvement...

Communication:

•The school and the teachers are doing a great job, especially this year with everything that has been going on. My only slight concern is a lack of correct communication at times. Or communication doesn't happen at all and we miss out on things. Just think this could be tightened up.

Feedback on child's progress:

•At times, it would be great to receive some more feedback about our child's progress as we only had one call in the first term and two calls during the homeschooling period. We are assuming he is ok as his reading and writing is progressing well, but it would be helpful to know if there is something we could focus on at home.

Other:

•I would recommend the school but with the reservation that the management is disorganised and not proactive in resolving issues that do arise. From the deputy -Sarah Harris

Are e-scooters illegal?

The only e-scooters that can be used on public roads are those rented as part of government-backed trials (not anywhere in Haringey). *If you own an e-scooter, only use it on private land and not on public roads, cycle lanes or pavements.*



Family Information & Events

Why can't they be used on public roads? They fall under the same laws and regulations as motor vehicles. They are subject to all the same legal requirements - MOT, tax, licensing and specific construction.

Please remember to **put suncream on your child** before they come to school when the weather gets hotter. **Children should not wear open toed sandals** to school as during play, children's toes can easily get broken.
