Important information about a Boundary Review



The Boundary Commission have been asked by the government to redraw the constituency map across the UK to ensure that each MP represents an approximately equal number of electors (between 69,724 and 77,062). The number of constituencies in the UK will remain at 650. The number in London will increase from 73 to 75. None of the new London constituencies will be near Tottenham.

The Boundary Commission is currently consulting on its initial proposals which it published on the 8th of June, 2021. A full copy of the Boundary Commissions "<u>Initial proposals for the new Parliamentary constituency boundaries in London region</u>", and the proposed boundaries for Tottenham can be found by clicking the link.

The main issue for us on Broadwater Farm (which is in West Green ward) is that West Green ward would be moved from Tottenham to Hornsey & Wood Green constituency.

As you appreciate, Broadwater Farm has a long history as part of Tottenham. West Green ward has been in a Tottenham constituency since its creation in 1885. The majority of the West Green population are located in the East of the ward with approximately half living in the BWF estate. For the majority of the ward, the nearest large high street is Tottenham High Road. To remove BWF from Tottenham at a time where Tottenham is being developed could have unforeseen consequences for us on BWF, especially at a time where the estate is also in the mist of renovation. The proposals would mean that Broadwater Farm would lose its attachment to the independent voice of Tottenham in Parliament and its status. It would be counter-intuitive if at this moment, just when the community is looking forward to a bright future with millions pounds of new investment in the form of the Future High Streets Fund if Broadwater Farm were to become disconnected from this identity and voice in Parliament.

Have your say

The initial consultation for on the initial proposals will last until **2 August 2021**. Submissions to the consultation can be made online at the <u>Boundary Commission for England website</u>. Comments can be attached to a particular location using the <u>interactive map</u>. General comments can also be submitted by clicking 'Make a general comment' at the bottom of the same webpage. Prepared documents and other evidence can be attached with either type of submission.
