Autumn 2021

<u>English</u>

This term we will examine stories with familiar settings through the text *Sweet Revenge*. We will also be exploring different myths and legends. In grammar we will focus on: nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives, and conjunctions.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths we will be comparing and ordering whole numbers to 1000; partitioning numbers into hundreds, tens and ones; revising our addition and subtraction facts to 100; and learning our multiplication tables.

<u>Science</u>

Rocks:

In Science we will be looking at rocks and identifying the different types (igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary) as well as planning an experiment and conducting a fair test.

<u>History</u>

Stone Age:

In the Stone Age topic, the children will develop a chronological understanding of the period and look at how people lived then and how it compares to life today.

Computing

We are programmers!

We will be using Scratch (an animation program) to create a sequence of movements for an animated character caught in a natural disaster.

<u>PSHE</u>

Grief and Loss

Children will be discussing their thoughts and feelings in the context of grief. This will include making a memory box about someone special.

<u>RE</u>

Children will develop their understanding of other cultures— this time with a focus on Judaism and Christianity.
