Message from Maureen

Dear Parents and Carers

Our first term is in full swing now and we are delighted to see that the majority of our children are enjoying being back at school and are coping well with the safety measures in place. We are providing them with a rigorous 'recovery' curriculum which is giving them the chance to explore their feelings and emotions following lockdown as well as giving them necessary structure and aspirational learning opportunities.

COVID UPDATE

You will have received many letters and texts about our COVID plans and safety measures but I do need to clarify the essential elements which follow the Government guidelines for Special Schools. These aim to keep your children, and our staff, as safe as possible.

- If your child is ill for any reason, please do not send them in
- If they are running a temperature / have a new, dry, persistent cough (ie coughing endlessly throughout an hour) or cannot taste anything, please keep them at home
- If they have the above COVID symptoms they cannot come into school for TEN days from the start of the symptoms UNLESS they have a COVID test and it is NEGATIVE.
- If any test is negative they can return before the ten days but we would need to see evidence of this in order to keep everyone in their class and family bubble safe.
- If any test is POSITIVE, then we must be informed immediately. Please email me on Maureen.duncan@thebrook.haringey.sch.uk ONLY the family bubble or the transport bubble in which a child or staff member has tested positive will need to be sent home.
- If your child becomes ill during the day with COVID symptoms then we *MUST INSIST* they go home in order to keep others safe.

We are not doctors so we cannot judge whether it is, or is not, a COVID cough. However, we must err on the side of caution and must abide by the self-isolation requirements. We are sure you will understand why this is important and would request that you accept the school's actions without reproach or anger.

REMOTE LEARNING

- If your child is away from school and ill we would not expect them to do any schoolwork. However, your school team will make contact with you every week of the illness
- If your child has to self-isolate but no one else in the bubble has to, then we will send you a home learning pack for him or her to use with your



input. Again we will make contact with you every week. A teacher cannot teach your child in that situation as they have to teach all the children still left in school.

• If a whole class or Family bubble has to isolate then there will be daily contact made by your school team with work set and on line learning opportunities offered. We will want to support you in every way we can during this time as we do understand how stressful it can be. However, it is important that our youngsters get continued education during periods of isolation at home.

TESTING

• It is now possible to get tests at the Irish Centre but these need to be booked in. Those of our colleagues and families who have had tests report that the results come back very quickly.

MORE CHEERFUL NEWS......

I am delighted to welcome **Tahnia Shabnum** as our new Parent Governor. Her nomination was unopposed so there was no need for us to hold an election. She has written something for this bulletin to introduce herself. Once again a big thank you to Katrina Serrette for representing Brook parents so ably during her time of office.














In Snowdrop class we have been exploring the different computing equipment we have in school, including the connecting tiles, interactive whiteboard, beebots and the virtual reality headset.





Message from Maureen

Dear Parents and Carers

Half term is fast approaching and I hope that it will not be too cold, icy or snowy. Our playground was very beautiful with its light snow covering that looked like icing sugar and we made sure that our children had the opportunity to experience playing in it – it is always a balancing act to make sure that they get every possible experience open to them whilst keeping them as safe as possible. Sadly there wasn't quite enough snow to make a snowman but that didn't stop them making patterns with their footsteps or holding it in their hands for as long as they could bear it – and I think it made it very easy for them to answer our question 'Is the weather hot or cold today'.

You will be aware that we are still awaiting Government guidelines on when we will be fully open after half term. We are continuing to provide remote learning for those children who remain at home and are teaching our usual curriculum in school — do take a look at our 'Brook online' page as we are adding new videos at all times. A big thank you to our staff who are prepared to be filmed — it is not everyone's cup of tea, but we know that our children really love seeing familiar faces and that is why we produce original works ourselves.

For those parents who bring children to school, you will have noticed that our marquee has disappeared: it managed to survive the gale force winds but did not survive the downpour of rain. We have ordered another and will ask you to line up under it again once it is erected to help us with our social distancing and smooth transition into the school building. Won't it be wonderful when we can invite you into the building again for coffee mornings, person centred reviews and parents' evenings?

We have had very few positive COVID cases reported and, to date, have not needed to close a bubble. Staff have been offered both the home testing kits and the vaccine and we continue to do everything we can to keep the school as safe as possible whilst maintaining consistency and normality wherever possible. I am sure you will join me in thanking all of our staff for their commitment, dedication and hard work this half term – we take it as a great compliment that you trust us to keep your children safe and that your children want to be at the Brook – and we are grateful for your continued support.



One new project we are hoping to work on over the next year, is to develop a dedicated area at the back of the school grounds which will have playground equipment in it that will develop our children's turn taking and play skills; will give them physical exercise; will help their sensory regulation and will also give them a chill out zone. It will be open to all of the BILC but, as it is a fenced area, this means that our children can be a little more independent in their play as staff will not be worried about them running too far away or hiding in inappropriate places. It is a very exciting project but as you can imagine, it is an expensive one – we will need to raise £100,000 to bring it to fruition – but the benefits for your children and those children attending the BILC in the future will be incalculable.

However you spend your half term, I hope that you and your families can relax, stay safe and well and we look forward to welcoming our children back on Monday 21st February.

Last week we were delighted to meet with the Master, Wardens and other members of the Worshipful Company of Glass sellers,

to receive a generous donation from them for our Science curriculum, and to share news of the Brook School. The Company dates back to 1664 when it received its charter from King Charles II. Its role then was to regulate the Glass Selling and Pot-Making industries within the City of London, and to ensure quality and fair trade. Today the company supports the glass selling industry through offering awards, scholarships and bursaries.

We have been very lucky to have been given a bursary and we are going to use it to enrich our science and PHSCE curriculum. We will be buying large mirrors – clear and wonky image ones (like you get in a funfair) to go onto our terraces for our children to have fun during sensory sessions and play times. We will be buying small mirrors that we can use in classrooms so that our children can explore their faces and expressions and we will be buying bug pots, bug magnifiers and magnifying glasses so that we can explore insect life in Fox Forest and in our pond.







As always, if you like what we do, please tell the world but if there is something you don't like, please tell us first so that we can do everything in our power to make things better.


