Holidays

As you will know, children are expected to be in attendance at school for the whole of each term and the DfE are very clear that in-term holidays cannot be authorised. We certainly find that when children are away from education for a period of time, their progress is affected. There are times, however, when there are family crises and we understand that there may be no extended family to look after your child. If this is the case then it is important that we have at least a week's notice so that we can provide work for your child to do in their absence. If we do not get any request for authorisation then we are obliged to contact the Education Welfare Service when there is an absence for which we do not know the reason. Thank you for your co-operation and understanding of this situation.

Heating

Our underfloor heating system has failed and the local Authority are working with us to get some temporary heating installed – as you can imagine this is a very big job due to the size of the building. The classrooms are not yet as warm as we would like them to be but we are assured that things should be up and running properly very soon. Do though, please, consider giving your child an extra layer of clothing in the interim and please make sure they have a coat, hat and gloves every day now that the weather is getting colder.

Thank you to all of you who have been sending in donations of snack items, fruit, money, toys and other items that we can use in class. As you know we have a charity and thanks to the money we have received, all classes have been given £80 pounds for this academic year to buy equipment or to put towards a lovely trip. 








































Swift class incorporate colorful semantics techniques to facilitate the creation of sentences and the expansion of their vocabulary.

Bumblebee class learned to operate and explore 'bee bots' during the ICT session














The children in lacewing class are choosing, exploring, mixing and tasting ingredients for our weekly cooking sessions.
