We had a celebration assembly to mark the end of the week and in this assembly we saw some lovely videos and photos of our children using their 'voice' to make choices, indicating their needs and enjoying life at school.

We are always very grateful to our drivers and escorts who bring our children to school. If they have a pleasant experience on the bus, it sets them up so well for learning during the day. One of our escorts Lilieth Cardoza celebrates her retirement next week after an amazing 22 years of service looking after our children. We are very sorry to say goodbye to her but extremely grateful to her for the care she has given our children over the years. She was our guest of honour at our assembly yesterday and went home with a keepsake, flowers and some personalised cards made by the children.

You will remember that when we had the Christmas Fayre we shared the money three ways. Yesterday two representatives from the NSPCC came to talk to some of our children about the work that the charity does and how it works to keep children safe. Our children asked some very insightful questions, met 'buddy' (the inflatable speech bubble mascot who reminds them





to 'speak up') and then presented them with the £300 that we raised for them at the Fayre. Katie and Alex were delighted to come down from the NSPCC central office to meet the children and acknowledged how fantastic it was that our children had been able to raise such a large amount to help others.

We have an INSET day on the first Monday back after half term where staff are being trained on positive behaviour support and also learning more about the PREVENT safeguarding strategy. We look forward to welcoming our children back on TUESDAY 20th FEBRUARY.














Kingfisher Class has been exploring the comparison between the Ghanaian Goldilocks story and the classic Goldilocks and the Three Bears fairy tale.

After this group activity, each pupil created their own individual representation.




