Dear Parents and Carers

As I write this, enormous bubbles are floating past my window accompanied by the sound of squealing and laughter. This is because we have 'Mr Bubble Man' who uses bubbles as a means of developing our children's communication, turn taking, attention and focus – the sessions keep the children spellbound (and staff too) so they are very reluctant to have to share Mr Bubble Man with the next class.

If you were to go into our therapy room this afternoon you would be amazed at how it has been transformed into a hair and beauty salon as part of our World of Work programme. Already it is possible to see how the 'staff' are improving their skills – they check if you have an appointment, take the payment and give a receipt (we are the cheapest hair washing service in Haringey at £1 a wash); wash, dry (with a hairdryer) and even style the hair. Last week some of our pupils ended up with fabulous braids – all done by their peers. Applying nail varnish is also one of the skills being taught and already the varnish is now being put only on the nails rather than knuckles and hands. It is so important that we open our children's eyes to the world of work and show them that they have many skills that they can develop to make a contribution to society when they get older.

Are you free on the afternoon of Saturday 18th June? If so, do bring your children and any member of the family who wants to come to a Tottenham community event here at school – it starts at 1.00pm and ends at 3.00pm with plenty of activities to enjoy as well as some performances. Although some staff will be attending, the event is not one the school has organised so we cannot provide any childcare.



We have had a Creative Arts week this week and there is an amazing exhibition of artwork in the foyer – our children never cease to amaze us with what they are able to produce and there are so many different techniques, styles and masterpieces on display. The TV screen also shows the children producing the work over the week. If you are coming into school over the next few days, please do have a look at the exhibition.

The temperature is starting to rise so please do make sure that you send your child in with sunhat and some suncream so we can protect their skin. We want the children to be outside as much as possible this term as it is far too nice to be cooped up inside – we also use the opportunity to go a little further afield too.

You may be wondering about your child's class for next year – we are having to delay sharing this information as we do not yet have names of all of our new children yet. We will let you know as soon as we have final confirmation from the Borough and then hope a Meet and Greet afternoon can be arranged before term ends. If not we will ensure that there is a meeting early in the new academic year.

Message from Maureen


Dear Parents and Carers,

AQA Achievement

We are so proud that all of our children received an AQA certificate for their work in Humanities this year and some received unit certification for expressive arts. As with all awards, pupils have to meet certain criteria and this is both internally assessed and externally assessed. 70 of our children received 1 unit certification; 25 children received 2; 3 children received 3 and 2 received 4 certificates. This is an amazing achievement – well done to all the pupils and the staff who work so hard to help our children make such significant progress.

21 of our Year 6 pupils worked with the Haringey charity myAFK to learn about the World of Work (WOW) and to take part in work experience 'taster' sessions. We are very grateful to the employers who hosted the visits and made sure our children worked hard! So a big thank you to Alexandra Palace, Morrisons, Organic Lea, Wood Green Conservation volunteers and Taylor Woodrow. This is an innovative project (as it is something that only usually happens in secondary school) which aims to widen our pupils' understanding of the world of work and to help them know and believe that they can take part in employment when they are older. The children had a wonderful time on each of their tasters; they worked hard and were very proud of their achievements.
