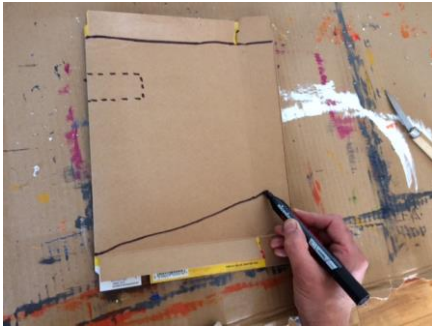

<p data-bbox="180 329 281 358"><u>Helmet</u></p> <p data-bbox="226 402 260 428">1-</p>  <p data-bbox="226 789 260 815">2-</p>  <p data-bbox="226 1175 260 1201">3-</p> 	<p data-bbox="1094 329 1352 358"><u>St George's helmet</u></p> <p data-bbox="1142 402 1717 428">1- Use an old cereal box or some spare card.</p> <p data-bbox="1142 841 1415 867">2- Cut/open the box.</p> <p data-bbox="1142 1208 1499 1234">3- Fold it inside out in half.</p>

4- Draw a rectangle for the eyes and the bottom line should be in an angle as shown.

5- Cut the excess of the card and save a spare bit.

6- Cut off the rectangle for the eyes.

7- Measure the size of the head and stick the spare bit on the back of the helmet with some tape. So the helmet stays in place without falling.

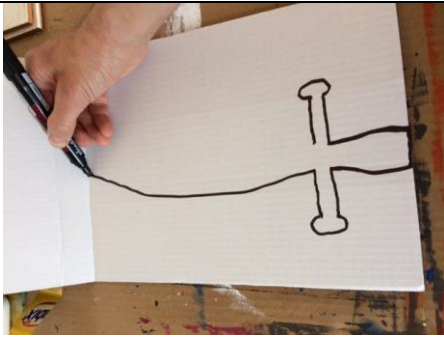


Sword

You can add another prop to the costume. **The sword.** If you don't want to use the sword/weapon you can always improvise with a wooden spoon.
