- The Manor Trust maintains The Elms, the lovely Grade II*Listed Building, and its grand Waterloo Room, The Elms is one of the top 8% of Listed Buildings in the country.
- The Trust also provides comfortable and kindly accommodation for the elderly in its properties especially The Lodge Residential Care Home,
- We have a small local museum, run by volunteers called the Bedhampton Historical Collection.
- It is through our events that we aim to engender a community spirit in the locality.

The Bedhampton Historical Collection

- The Bedhampton Historical Collection is run by a small group of volunteers and has an impressive set of artefacts collected over many years by the founder Trustee Cynthia Hoy who has bequeathed her collection to the Trust.

The Luncheon Club

- Meets each Thursday in the Waterloo Room. The club is a happy gathering of retired people living locally who come to enjoy the getting together and a luncheon of a two-course meal followed by tea, all prepared and served by volunteers.

Fund Raising

- The Manor Trust hosts three major events during the year, the Art Exhibition in May, the Garden Party in August and the Coffee Morning with Christmas Gifts stalls at the end of November.
