At the Lodge

As many of you know Tania is retiring after 30 years, 15 of those years as our Deputy Manager and interviews were held on Friday 24th August 2018 for a new Deputy Manager.

We can report that we have chosen as her successor Jemma Marsh who is a Senior Carer at the Lodge. We congratulate Jemma who fought off well qualified opposition in order to gain full marks at interview. Her IT and Leadership skills will be a great asset to us and to our Manager Jacqui.

Also, on the management side we now have digital records and care plans; giving staff more time to spend with residents. Training days were held on 20th and 21st September and this is seen as a great step forward with both residents and staff excited about these changes especially to the care plans. Also, on 15th October saw the start of a complete refurbishment of bathroom 1, which will be of great help to both residents and staff and is another step towards the modernisation of The Lodge, which to remind you was first registered 35 years ago.

Other Charity Activities.

On Sunday16th September it was National Heritage Open Day.

The Waterloo room and BHC room were once again open from 11am - 4pm with many visitors coming to see the BHC and artefacts in the WR and Library. This year there was a WW1 theme to commemorate the end of the conflict, including the exhibition sponsored by The University of Portsmouth entitled Westerman's Great War - a look at the children adventure books by the Portsmouth author, Percy F Westerman during the war.

A video of the renovation of the exterior of the Elms was shown on a lap top depicting just why the refurbishment was so badly needed. "The Elms is one of only eight buildings in the country with Grade II* status and gothic type architecture, and is therefore <u>a very important piece of our</u> <u>Country's heritage</u>". Our next task is to refurbish the Waterloo room itself. Please see dates below.

The trustees are also looking at how the drive can be improved and are in touch with English Heritage and the LPOA (Listed Property Owners Association, which the Trust joined this year), for ideas on materials to use.
