



Rottingdean Parish Council – Parking News

November 2017

A Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) was recently approved by Brighton & Hove City Council to introduce a number of new parking restrictions within the village – the extension of and introduction of double yellow lines in Court Ord Road, Dean Court Road and St Aubyns Mead. The majority of these works are now complete and an update on these and other issues is included below.

Parking Issues Log

Issue	Potential solution / latest position
<u>Court Road / Falmer Road</u> – Vehicles parked close to the junction causing the narrowing of the carriageway, making it difficult to pass and obstructing the safe manoeuvring into and out of the junction.	Double yellow lines are due to be extended further into Court Ord Road – approved as part of the recently approved TRO.
<u>The Green</u> – Vehicles parked across the grass verge and pavement adjacent to the bowling green, causing an obstruction to pedestrians and damaging the grass.	RPS has been in correspondence with the Bowling Club to reinforce the request to not obstruct the pavement and there has been some improvement. The situation will continue to be monitored.
<u>West Street</u> – Vehicles are obstructing the pavement by parking on the forecourt in front of Lloyds pharmacy, forcing pedestrians and wheelchair users in to the road.	Lloyds have installed some new signage and lines demarking the private forecourt area. Cars continue to obstruct the entrance to Golden Square and BHCC have been asked to take appropriate enforcement action.
<u>Dean Court Road</u> – Parked vehicles at the bottom of the road make passing difficult causing vehicles to drive onto the pavement or to reverse.	A stretch of double yellow lines has now been painted to create a passing place. Residents are asked to provide feedback on whether this alleviates the problem and to call the BHCC Parking hotline to report vehicles parking here and also on the DYLS at the junction with The Green.
<u>St Aubyns Mead</u> – The turning circle at the bottom of the road is often blocked with parked vehicles making it	A stretch of double yellow line has been painted.



impossible to turn around and resulting in vehicles having to reverse back up

Alternatively you can use the online form – [click here](#). During the hours of 8am to 8pm a parking officer will usually attend within one hour.

Please be aware that action can only be taken against vehicles parking in contravention of the parking regulations, e.g. parked on a yellow line when no loading or unloading is taking place, in a disabled bay without displaying a blue disabled badge or parked on the zig-zag markings at a pedestrian crossing. Unfortunately vehicles parked on the footway or close to a junction where there is no yellow line cannot be enforced against.
