1.Noise nuisance: RPC advises keeping a noise diary and contacting the Environmental Health team at Brighton and Hove City Council: -

Information to be provided must include:

- Name & address & telephone number (anonymous complaints are not accepted)
- The address where the noise is coming from
- The type of noise (music, dog barking, alarm sounding)
- When & for how long the noise occurs
- The way the noise affects you such as keeping you awake
- Anything you have done to try deal with the problem.

Your identity will only be revealed by the Council in the event of formal action being taken.

Cycling: recent resident' interest has been expressed in a campaign for bike lanes with options including traffic and cycle sharing as put in place recently in Arundel Road West, & Central Peacehaven. Benefits described include better protection of cyclists, and potentially forcing traffic to slow down in areas such as Falmer Road, Rottingdean where the 20mph restriction is currently often ignored.
