[Adults who disclose childhood sexual abuse](#)

Victims of childhood sexual abuse carry the experience of abuse into adulthood. One of the dilemmas victims face during adulthood is the decision to disclose or conceal the abuse.

This guidance provides professionals with information on how to respond to disclosures and services that offer support.

[Modern Slavery](#)

Modern Slavery is a form of organised crime in which individuals, including children, are treated as commodities and exploited for criminal gain.

This guidance provides information on how to identify and respond to a child or young person where there are concerns that they are a victim or a potential victim of modern slavery.

Most parents and carers have the capability and want to provide good or good enough parenting for their children, most of the time. Sometimes, the parent will have such overwhelming needs of their own that they may not have the capacity to be such a capable parent. This protocol supports early intervention work that can make a real positive difference to the outcomes for children and their families.
