



CHILD EXPLOITATION

Child exploitation occurs where an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child or young person under the age of 18 into criminal or sexual activity for financial gain, sexual gratification, labour or personal gain.

Forcing a child to take part in criminal or sexual activities leads to physical and emotional harm to the child.
