LEARNING FROM REVIEWS

Safeguarding children can be complex and continuing to develop knowledge, skills and confidence in these areas is essential. Learning from reviews holds particular significance for multi-agency practitioners. National and local reviews, along with audits, often highlight recurring themes or 'perennial issues.' An understanding of these challenges, coupled with the practical application of learning from these perennial issues is essential to safeguarding and promote the welfare of Isle of Wight children.
