









Child Exploitation Safeguarding Practice Week

13 - 17 October 2025

Child exploitation cannot be addressed by a single agency working in isolation. Effective collaboration between partners, particularly around information sharing, is essential for the protection of children who are thought or known to be at risk of one or more forms of exploitation.

Behaviours that may not initially seem linked to child sexual or criminal exploitation can, when considered in context, reveal a more serious safeguarding concern. Different agencies often hold separate pieces of information, and when shared, these can help build a fuller picture of the risks facing a child. This collaborative approach enables professionals to use the most effective tools to disrupt perpetrators and protect children.
