

## Isle of Wight Domestic Abuse Safeguarding Practice Week: 25th–29th November 2024

The National Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel’s briefing, [Multi-agency safeguarding and domestic abuse](#), outlines four core practice principles that should guide our work with children and young people, their parents, wider families and networks in relation to domestic abuse. These principles offer a shared approach to inform practice and should be viewed as interconnected and interdependent.

It summarises the most common themes that emerged in relation to multi-agency safeguarding for children who are victims of domestic abuse, and includes examples of practice and recommendations.
