

Bottom Towed Fishing Gear Byelaw 2023

The Bottom Towed Fishing Gear Byelaw 2023 is the outcome of a review of BTFG management in the Southern IFCA District in response to the addition of new Marine Conservation Zones (MCZs) and updated best available evidence to inform designated feature location & extent in MCZs, SACs & SPAs.

The maps below show existing BTFG prohibited areas under the Southern IFCA BTFG Byelaw 2016 and **new areas under the BTFG Byelaw 2023** which are now in place.

What are the regulations?

A person must not use bottom towed fishing gear within a prohibited area

A person must not use a vessel carrying bottom towed fishing gear while transiting through a

prohibited area unless all parts of that gear are inboard and above the sea
