- Over 600 new volunteers volunteered for the first time in 2016 with over 200 different volunteer opportunities available across Newham and outside of Newham.
- Over 27,000 hours of volunteering recorded in 2016. •
- 15 volunteers secured external employment. •
- 5 volunteers are now working with activeNewham.
- Male 42%, Female 58% •

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Stratford Park Project: MACE

In September, Mace Construction worked with activeNewham on an ambitious project in Stratford Park resulting in a massive revamp. As well as a complete refurbishment of the classroom in the park keeper's lodge, Mace also gave the sensory garden a complete makeover including new paths and seating area. In a great example of partnership working, the volunteer's team brought together volunteers from MACE as well as Barclays Bank, The Financial Conduct Authority, Westfield and young people from the Youth Offending Team. Over a 3 week period they put in around 1,350 hours. MACE also funded all the works totalling close to £100k.

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HELP US TO HELP YOU!

If you are approached by any organisations directly to volunteer on events/opportunities without coming through activeNewham, please could you contact us immediately and let us know so we can record your attendance. This ensures that we do not miss recording of any hours which could affect references, training opportunities and also, health & safety should anything happen to you while volunteering. Also, if you are volunteering externally and not via activeNewham, please ensure that you are not wearing your Newham's Volunteers Green T-Shirt.

REFERENCES

It is activeNewham's policy to provide a standard reference which states the date a volunteer joined our programme and whether or not they are still volunteering with us at present. Volunteers cannot request a reference themselves as the request needs to come directly from the employer/organisation. To obtain a reference volunteers need to demonstrate a good level of commitment. If a volunteer has not been actively volunteering for the past 1 year, we will be unable to provide a reference.

DBS CHECKS

DBS checks are only carried out for roles that require you to work on a one to one basis with young children and/or vulnerable adults.



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EXPENSES

All expenses will be paid directly into your account via bank transfer. Please allow 30 days for payments to be made into your accounts (from the date you submit your receipts and volunteer expense form).

When submitting your expense form, please ensure you provide us with the correct bank details along with the actual event/opportunity you volunteered for and the actual journey route you took. We would also like to take this opportunity to remind you that you can only claim back expenses up to the sum of £5.

Any expenses that go over £5 will be capped. When providing your receipts please ensure that they are your actual journey printouts (see picture). We advise all volunteers to register their Oyster cards online. This is a free service which will enable you to print out all your journeys. Without the Oyster Card Statement, we will not be able to process any of your expenses. PLEASE NOTE: We are unable to accept payment/top up receipts.

ACTIVENEWHAM HEAD OFFICE – APPOINTMENTS ONLY

If you wish to see a member of staff at our Head Office, please contact us first to make an appointment. If you attend without an appointment, you may not be seen as the Volunteers Team may be unavailable. Please call us on 0203 770 4444 and select option 5. This will avoid any disappointment and staff will ensure they are available to assist you.
