Draft Screening Opinion on the need for a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) and a Habitats Regulation Assessment (HRA)

Burnham on Crouch Neighbourhood Plan Regulation 16 consultation version

Introduction

- 1. This report is prepared by Maldon District Council's Planning Policy Team on behalf of the Burnham-on-Crouch Town Council (the qualifying body) and provides a draft screening opinion into the contents of the Regulation 16 Consultation version of the Burnham-on-Crouch Neighbourhood Plan (BoCNP). The purpose of screening opinions is to ensure that environmental and habitat considerations are incorporated into the draft plan in accordance with the regulations. Consultation on earlier versions of the Neighbourhood Plan included consultation on the screening opinion with the three consultation bodies: Historic England, Natural England and the Environment Agency.
 - 2. The BoCNP has been complied by the Burnham on Crouch Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group and consultants Allies and Morrison Urban Practitioners; and aims to provide locally derived and agreed guidance which will help inform planning decisions and shape the future of the Town Council area and other land and property interests within the designated Neighbourhood Plan Area.
- 3. The BoCNP has a number of supporting evidence base documents, such as a baseline report, preliminary draft of policies, and has conducted a number of consultations with the community as well as consulting English Heritage, Natural England and the Environment Agency in the preliminary stages in order to establish a framework of draft objectives and policies which are were included and consulted upon in the draft plan (known as a Regulation 14 plan). A similar consultation is being held for the Regulation 16 (presubmission) version of the BoCNP.
- 4. Maldon District Council has a duty to check and determine whether the BoCNP meets the prescribed legal requirements as set out in S38A of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 and Schedule 4B of the 1990 Act. There are also other non-environmental EU obligations that the Neighbourhood Plan should be compatible with, for example the European Convention on Human Rights.
- 5. Section 1 of the report details a final screening opinion as to whether a Strategic Environment Assessment (SEA) is required, and has only minor changes compared to earlier versions.
- 6. Section 2 details a draft screening opinion as to whether a Habitats Regulation Assessment (HRA) is required (see Appendix 4). This assess all the policies in the current Regulation 16 consultation version of the Plan, building upon the earlier screening opinions for the initial and Regulation 14 versions of the Plan.
- 7. The results of screening the neighbourhood plan against the assessment criteria will highlight where likely significant effects are predicted. If any significant effects are likely then a Strategic Environmental Assessment or Habitats Regulation Assessment will be required. If the outcome of the screening exercise determines that there are not likely to the significant effects then no further action is required for this stage of the Neighbourhood Plan process.

8. A draft screening opinion on the initial version of the Plan was undertaken by Maldon District Council and was forwarded to the three consultation bodies under Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012 for a determination of whether they agree with the findings of the report, or alternatively request that a full SEA or HRA be undertaken. The responses were taken into account in developing the Regulation 14 version of the BoCNP. A similar consultation is being held for the Regulation 16 version of the BoCNP.

Section 1: Screening Opinion as to whether there are significant effects which will result in an SEA will be required

Legislative Background

- 9. The basis for Strategic Environmental Assessments and Sustainability Appraisal legislation is European Directive 2001/42/EC and was transposed into English law by the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004, or SEA Regulations.
- 10. Although Sustainability Appraisals are required for Local Plans, this does not apply to Neighbourhood Plans which are not 'Local Plans', or 'Development Plan Documents' as defined by the 2004 Planning Act. Neighbourhood Development Plans have their own designation: they are neighbourhood development plans produced by qualifying bodies under the Localism Act.
- 11. In order to undertake a Screening Opinion as to whether the BoCNP requires an SEA, this assessment follows guidance as stated in Figure 1 which is from 'A practical guide to the Strategic Environment Directive September 2005.'

Assessment

- 12. Appendix 1 and 2 detail the Local Planning Authority's screening opinion. Although as detailed in Appendix 2 that earlier consultation and feedback of the drafting of policies identified likely effects to the historic environment and the natural environment (Appendix 3), these effects are able to be mitigated by the alteration of policies in accordance with advice from Historic England and the LPA, and any further advice received from consultation bodies during the request for whether they agree with the screening opinion.
- 13. Taking the above into account, it is considered that after amendments included in the Draft (Regulation 14) Neighbourhood Plan that no likely significant effects would arise as a result of the BoCNP and therefore an SEA would not be required at that stage.
- 14. A further screening opinion was conducted on the Regulation 16 version of the BoCNP. The three consultation bodies were again consulted. Their comments will be taken into consideration by the Examiner holding the examination on the Neighbourhood Plan.

Section 2: Screening opinion as to whether there are significant effects as to whether a HRA Assessment will be required

Legislative Background

- 15. European sites (also known as Natura 2000 sites) are recognised under the EU Habitats Directive, and consist of designations such as Special Areas of Conservation (SAC), Special Protection Areas (SPA), Offshore Marine Sites (OMS) and Ramsar wetlands sites. There are considered to be three Natura 2000 sites (Appendix 3) within relative proximity to the Burnham-on-Crouch Neighbourhood Plan Area boundary:
 - Crouch and Roach Estuaries SPA and RAMSAR site: The Rivers Crouch and Roach adjoin the Neighbourhood Plan area boundary. The River Crouch occupies a shallow valley between two ridges of London Clay, whilst the River Roach is set predominantly between areas of brick earth and loams with patches of sand and gravel. The intertidal zone along the Rivers Crouch and Roach is 'squeezed' between the sea walls of both banks and the river channel. This leaves a relatively narrow strip of tidal mud unlike other estuaries in the county, which, nonetheless, is used by significant numbers of birds. One species is present in internationally important numbers, and three other species of wader and wildfowl occur in nationally important numbers. Additional interest is provided by the aquatic and terrestrial invertebrates and by an outstanding assemblage of nationally scarce plants.
 - Essex Estuaries SAC: This is a large estuarine site which adjoins the Neighbourhood Plan Area boundary, and is a typical, undeveloped, coastal plain estuarine system with associated open coast mudflats and sandbanks. The site comprises the major estuaries of the Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach Rivers and is important as an extensive area of contiguous estuarine habitat. Essex Estuaries contains a very wide range of characteristic marine and estuarine sediment communities and some diverse and unusual marine communities in the lower reaches, including rich sponge communities on mixed, tide-swept substrates.
 - Dengie SPA and Ramsar site: Dengie is a large and remote area of tidal mudflat and saltmarsh at the eastern end of the Dengie peninsula, between the Blackwater and Crouch Estuaries. The saltmarsh is the largest continuous example of its type in Essex. Foreshore, saltmarsh and beaches support an outstanding assemblage of rare coastal flora. It hosts internationally and nationally important wintering populations of wildfowl and waders, and in summer supports a range of breeding coastal birds including rarities. The formation of cockleshell spits and beaches is of geomorphological interest.
- 16. As the three sites are considered to be within relative proximity of the Neighbourhood Planning Area, there is the potential for significant effects to the designated sites. As such, the screening opinion as shown in Appendix 4 will assess each individual policy as put forward in the preliminary draft, Regulation 14 and Regulation 16 plans.
- 17. The purpose of undertaking a screening opinion for Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA) is to ensure that a plan will not result in significant damage to these protected sites. Maldon

District Council is a 'competent authority' under the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010 and needs to ensure that Neighbourhood Plans have been assessed through the Habitats Regulations process.

18. The initial screening will mainly be assessing the proximity of any European site to the Neighbourhood Area which could be affected by the proposals within the Neighbourhood Plan. If it is decided that a full HRA may be required, it is advised that a qualified consultant ecologist carries out this work, since this requires technical skills and knowledge. The HRA findings should then be taken into account and referred to in the environmental assessment of the plan.

Assessment

- 19. Appendix 4 shows the assessment of each of the preliminary draft, Regulation 14 and Regulation 16 policies of the BoCNP of whether the policies will be likely to cause significant effects to the natural environment and the designated Natura 2000 sites. As the three Natura sites interlink with each other as the marine and natural environment around the estuary, the potential for significant effects may be likely to affect all three sites to some degree, hence if potential effects were identified on one site, it is plausible that all three may be affected to some extent and should be flagged in this screening opinion.
- 20. It was viewed that policies relating to works within the marine environment may cause potential significant effects, on the basis that no impact studies have been undertaken to substantiate the ambitions as expressed in the policies. Earlier policies regarding the provision of a link road and walking routes also caused concerns regarding potential effects to the natural environment and Natura 2000 sites.
- 21. It is viewed that the potential effects identified at earlier stages could be mitigated with the inclusion of new policies, the appropriate deletion or re-wording of policies to ensure that there would be no significant effects to designated Natura 2000 sites in the plan. Some policies such as the link road proposals would not be in conformity with the Local Development Plan and were deleted.
- 22. At Regulation 14 a policy was introduced (EN.4) to require all planning proposals to demonstrate that there is not likely to be any significant effects on the international sites through HRA screening. This policy is expanded upon in the Regulation 16 version.
- 23. In the draft screening opinion on the Regulation 16 version, two policies in the Riverside chapter were identified, where the level of future river activity that may result from the policies and the subsequent level of impacts are unknown, meaning it is not possible to assess the potential effects on the Natural 2000 sites. As a precaution these policies have been flagged as amber. However, these concerns may be overcome, as a result of the consultation responses from the three consultation bodies. Any necessary amendments to the policies can be made at the Examination stage.



Appendix 4: Habitats Regulation Assessment Screening Report

The table below shows assessments undertaken at each of the stages of the Plan, from the initial assessment for the February 2015 version, the regulation 14 consultation version and the Regulation 16 consultation version. The assessment rates the likely effects on each of the three Natura 2000 sites using the green, amber and red system:

- A 'green' policy means that there is thought to be enough information available at present to conclude that there is no likely significant effect from the policy on the integrity of international sites or their favourable conservation objectives;
- An 'amber' policy is one that may have potential for significant effects. There is however potential for mitigation by amending/deleting policies at the Examination so that effects can be mitigated and monitored through the Neighbourhood Planning process;
- A 'red' policy is one that can be identified as having a significant effect on the integrity of the international sites based on current information and is not possible for mitigation by changes or amendments to the policy.

The purpose of showing the assessments from the initial Feb 2015 to the 2016 Reg 16 version is to illustrate any changes in the assessment as a result of changes made to the document either to address any potential effects, or for changes in the policies following earlier consultations. New policies which were previously not included in earlier versions are also included and are notated and assessed for their potential likely significant effects.

The assessment for the Feb 2015 version is shown in the first three columns.

After receiving advice from Natural England, Environment Agency, and Historic England, the screening opinion was amended by the inclusion of the fourth column which shows a new assessment of the Neighbourhood Plan for the Regulation 14 consultation. This column shows an updated HRA/SEA screening opinion assessment as well as wording indicating what has changed between the February 2015 version to the Regulation 14 Version.

Similarly, an additional column has been added for the 2016 Regulation 16 consultation version. The comments on the regulation 16 version are shown in red. This draft assessment of the Regulation 16 version of the plan will be consulted upon at the same time as the Neighbourhood Plan.
