In early 2026, Pope Leo XIV emphasized that young people should not be afraid to ask God what He is calling them to, whether to priesthood, religious life, marriage, or family life. He urged youth to "Be open to what the Lord has in store. Let God lead and guide you."

## Holy Father's Vocations Message 2026: "The Interior Discovery of God's Gift"



For the 63rd World Day of Prayer for Vocations on Sunday April 26th, 2026, Pope Leo XIV released a message titled "The Interior Discovery of God's Gift," calling vocations an "adventure of love and happiness". He urged the faithful to nourish their calling through prayer, silence, and daily relationships with God, emphasizing that vocations are not impositions but divine gifts.

### Key elements of the Holy Father's message:

**Interior Life & Prayer:** The Pope emphasized that cultivating an interior life, silence, and prayer is essential to recognize and respond to God's call.

**"Gift" to be Nurtured:** Vocations are not static, but a path to be nurtured daily, not just a one-time, "given" item.

**Call to Action:** He called on families, parishes, and educators to create environments where vocations can be welcomed, nourished, and protected.

**"Good Shepherd Sunday":** The message for Good Shepherd Sunday encourages focusing on Christ who gives his life for his sheep, highlighting that life is beautiful when following Him.

**Youth & Courage:** Earlier, at the SEEK 2026 conference, Pope Leo encouraged young people not to be afraid of their vocations, whether priesthood, religious life, or marriage, and to trust that God knows their deepest longings

His message strongly highlights the need to combat the "deafening noise of the world" with inner quiet and divine dialogue. Pope Leo XIV message

## World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

Pope Leo presided over the Mass of priestly ordination of 8 men in St. Peter's Basilica.

Two days earlier the 8 men gathered at St. John Lateran Basilica for a prayer vigil for vocations, themed "The Inner Discovery of God's Gift." This theme echoes Pope Leo's message, which carries the same title, published for the 63rd World Prayer Day for Vocations.

The Holy father was not able to be present at the Vigil. A communication from the Congregation for the Clergy shared his "fatherly closeness" to the initiative, which he spiritually accompanies, seeing it as "a living sign of communion and ecclesial synergy in service of vocations."

Cardinal Lazzaro You Heung Sik, Prefect of the Congregation for the Clergy, to which Serra International is aggregated attended the vigil together with Cardinal Baldo Reina, the Pope's Vicar General for the Diocese of Rome, The liturgy was led by the Roman Major Seminary and accompanied by the Diocesan Choir, The vigil featured moments of listening to the Word of God, testimonies and a special involvement of young people.

We have many vigils for vocations being held at various times and venues throughout the year. The vigils which take place on the Thursday or Friday preceding Good Shepherd Sunday, were importantly developed to coincide with the Holy Father's message for vocations giving some 48 hours of continuous prayer in parishes throughout the planet.

The Vigils usually following a programme of Eucharistic celebration followed by Adoration, silent reflection, Rosary for vocations, with guest speakers focusing on priestly and consecrated religious vocations,



concluding with Night prayer and Benediction.

## The Scavi



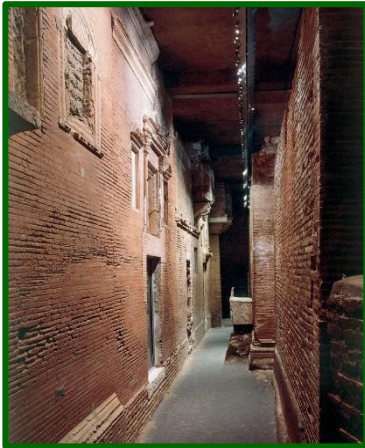
Recently, I met up with a priest friend, now retired, and started reminiscing over past encounters. On this occasion we highlighted our meeting many years ago in Rome, the Vatican, St Peter’s Basilica.



Among the other memorable stories and sights, we shared our unforgettable memories of a visit to the Vatican Necropolis referred to as the Scavi.

The Tomb of St Peter is here in this City of the dead, which had remained inaccessible and untouched for sixteen centuries.

Beneath the floor of the Constantinian basilica and of course beneath St Peter’s Basilica this massive Renaissance building built in the 16<sup>th</sup> century over those foundations. We



rediscover the roots of the Roman Church, which sprang from this land watered by the blood of the Holy Protomartyrs. It is here that Saint Peter was crucified upside down and buried in a simple rock tomb, and here many popes are buried. This is where we return to the dawn of Christianity in the West. It is upon the humble tomb of the Galilean Fisherman that this majestic basilica rises, the largest church on earth, serving both as a treasure chest that preserves it and as a home that gathers all believers.

It is here in the Scavi that we encounter the tomb, that contained the body of Peter. It lies in the western section

containing many other burial sites from the first and second centuries alongside that of the apostle.

But not only the tomb but the bones of St Peter. The revered relics of the Apostle Peter, were discovered here in the 1940’s some 5-12 meters beneath the floor and high altar of St. Peter’s Basilica. The bones can be seen by projecting a laser beam within the tomb. (*not always available as part of the tour for obvious reasons.*)



If you ever had doubts about your faith, see this, return to the floor of the basilica and look up to the Copula, the dome of St Peter’s and read the 2 meter high words “Thou art Peter and upon this rock I will build my church”

## *The Month of June dedicated to the Sacred Heart.*

In each edition of the *focus* I emphasise “Adoration for Vocations” and over the years I have known many priests who owe their priestly vocation to spending time at Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and many priests, religious sisters and brothers who consider time spent at adoration as time to reflect and spiritually grow their priesthood and consecrated lives.

Our Holy Father emphasizes that the answer to our deepest struggles and longings is encountering Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration. “Even when we do not feel his presence, our faith tells us that he is there.” To entrust our struggles to Jesus, we have to spend time with him in prayer. We have to have a relationship with him. In quiet, we can speak honestly about what is in our hearts. During Eucharistic adoration, you can look at Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and know that he looks at you with love.

### The Diocese of Westminster



On Good Shepherd Sunday, a Pastoral Letter from Archbishop Richard Moth was read in parishes across the Diocese. In his letter, the Archbishop called on the faithful to pray for priestly vocations. The practice of Eucharistic Adoration is an aspect of parish life in many parts of the Diocese. Adoration provide excellent opportunities for prayer for priestly vocations.

The praying of the Rosary is a part of many people’s lives of prayer. I invite parishes to form groups of people who will commit to praying the Rosary for vocations to priesthood, whether this be together or alone but united with others through prayer.

Our Lord often speaks to us gently in silence. Whether through adoration, reading Scripture, talking to him, looking for those little spaces of time where we can be with him, little by



little, we learn to hear his voice to feel his presence both within and through the people that he sends to us.

### It’s only a game with pupils from our School’s projects.



The object of the game was first of all to get pupils to think about what were their goals in life, then which of these were the most important, and then how different careers/jobs matched up to these high importance goals. Then they were asked to consider how the vocation of priest or religious also matched up to these goals.

- step 1. each pupil in the group invited to write down their goal in life on a postcard. (e.g. be happy; be popular; make money; job satisfaction; recognition; security)
- step 2. then group work together to arrange their cards into a pyramid of importance (most important at top; then next two; then next three; then bottom four)
- step 3 ask a pupil to write their preferred career/job on a card and place this above the metre stick
- step 4 then use the top three important goals and place them below the metre stick according to the extent that the career delivers on each goal (from 0% to 100%)
- step 5 do the same with another careers/job, then ask them to do the same for a priest, then a religious.



This exercise generates not just much individual involvement, it also generates considerable discussion and group work in deciding on the pyramid of importance. Finally it is very interesting to see how they place their cards when considering the priesthood and religious life, providing many

opportunities for Serrans to contribute to their understanding and sometimes their misunderstanding of the nature of a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. ....*Ricky*

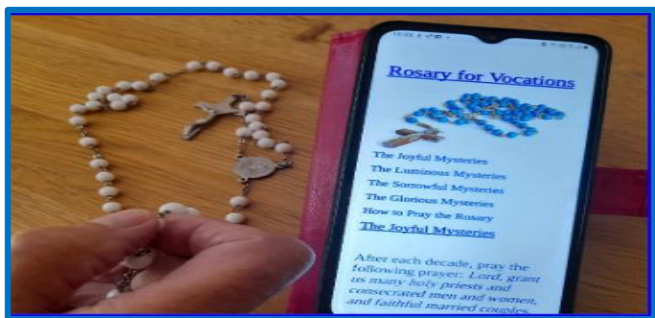
