Sussex IFCA Hand Gathering Quick Reference Guide – Species and Bag Limits



For quick reference only, hand gatherers must read the Hand Gathering Permit Byelaw and guidance at https://www.sussex-ifca.gov.uk/regulations

If you are NOT gathering in a Marine Protected Area*, the following bag limits apply (Minimum Sizes apply District wide):

You may only exceed the bag limits listed above (with the exception of Lobster and Edible Crab limits that apply to all persons) if you hold a current hand gathering permit, issued by Sussex IFCA.

Minimum size regulations apply to a number of crustacean and mollusc species; you must not take them below specified size limits. All crustaceans and mollusc species must be measured correctly in accordance with the Minimum Size (Fish, Crustacea and Mollusc)

You must not gather piddock, native oyster or kelp. You must not damage sea grass beds.

You are responsible for obtaining permission from a landowner, or other rights holder, to hand gather where such rights apply.

You must not use chemicals or electrical devices to hand gather species.

* Additional restrictions apply within six Marine Protected Areas within the Sussex IFCA District. These six MPAs and additional restrictions are described within the Hand Gathering Byelaw's six schedules. You must check the Byelaw or specific Byelaw guidance for Chichester Harbour, Pagham Harbour, Medmerry & Bracklesham Bay, Beachy Head East and West MCZ's, Adur Estuary SSSI and Dungeness, Romney Marsh and Rye Bay SPA.

Please abide by the <u>Hand Gathering Code of Conduct</u>:

- Tell someone where you intend to dig
- Be aware of local hazards, tides and conditions
- Do not dig around moorings, slipways or sea walls
- Back fill all holes and trenches, for safety and to maintain habitats
- Replace all rocks and stones
- Avoid disturbing wildlife and marine heritage
- Take your litter home
- Treat the foreshore with respect
