Workshop Leaders





Our workshops are designed to enable students to understand the key practitioner styles that have influenced and shaped theatre practices today.



We can design the workshop as an introduction to the practitioners; Stanislavski, Brecht and Artaud or as an extension to previous learning. Our workshops will provide a comprehensive insight into the different theatrical approaches, conventions and devices of each practitioner. The exercises can be applied into the creative and devising process or interlinked with specific textual work that the students are currently studying. We understand that most examinations boards will expect a contextual insight into the practitioners and what influenced their own theatre practices. Our workshop leader will provide a short presentation at the start of the workshop with a supporting handout on the contextual background of the practitioner for future examination revision or coursework.



- To provide a brief contextual introduction to Constantin Stanislavski and his work in the early 20th century.
- To introduce the Stanislavski method of acting to help students create realistic portrayals of their characters for audition, performance and examination work.
- To practically explore and apply key Stanislavski techniques to support the students acting development.
- To provide a brief contextual introduction to Bertolt Brecht and his early influences.
- To introduce Brecht's Epic Theatre and the Verfremdungseffekt.
- To practically explore Brecht's key techniques, either applying his theories to the student's current textual work, devising process or through an introductory session.
- To provide a brief contextual introduction to Antonin Artaud.
- To introduce students to his anti-bourgeois and free thinking theatre.
- To introduce Artaud's Manifestos of the Theatre of Cruelty.





Workshops can be designed to help students interpret set texts, examination pieces or audition monologues that you are working on as part of the curriculum or in production.



Our workshops are about making Shakespeare accessible; translating the language and context into a relatable performance piece. The workshop leader will explore the lambic Pentameter, speaking verse and prose, visual storytelling and contextualising the work into modern parallels to enable students to fully understand the meaning and background of the work. The workshops will encourage actors to feel more confident and self-assured whilst performing Shakespeare which will improve their studies and performance skills long term.



- To create a bespoke workshop with a trained specialist in Classical Theatre and Shakespeare

- Bringing text to life through practical exploration, off text improvisation, vocal techniques and character work

- Thematic awareness and understanding the contextual background of Shakespeare's work and its meaning within the 21st Century





Our workshops are designed to support devising projects at every stage of the process. Our workshops leaders can support the initial responses to stimuli, development of ideas and creating the final performance piece as part of the students studies and final examination work.



Our workshop leader's are trained at degree and MA level and have a comprehensive understanding of theatrical styles & techniques within the devising process. Applied theatre workshops will focus on creating work with a community focus, using theatre of change and in education. We can plan the workshop to tackle specific community issues that will help to raise awareness in the final performance pieces. We can also work in accordance with any community events and charitable projects that have been planned within the academic calendar. Our specialist workshop leaders can plan a workshop to support current community projects, theatre in education work, children's theatre and generic devised pieces that requires a specific practitioner style and influence. As part of the workshop we can include a short session on playwriting and how to translate the practical findings into a script for future performance work.



- Using improvisation to create original material with a community focus (Applied Theatre)
- To enable students to create a unique piece of theatre, supporting subject matters / topics and themes which the students are currently studying as part of their studies
- To create theatre that promotes inclusion, whilst tackling social issues that may be impacting the students or the wider community using Theatre for Change and in Education (Applied Theatre)
- To experiment with a wide range of devising methods which derive from Brecht's theatre practice, Augusto Boal - Forum Theatre and contemporary practitioners such as Frantic Assembly, Knee High Theatre, Forced Entertainment and Action Hero.
- To focus on storytelling and ensemble playing, encouraging a multi-disciplinary piece of theatre which explores the students skills base
- To collate all practical findings into a short session on creative playwriting
- To work with the students current stimuli to help generate comprehensive ideas and material, whilst working with the specification requirements for GCSE, AS, A LEVEL and BTEC for Devising Theatre





Our workshops are designed to provide an honest and supportive insight into the professional practices required to succeed whilst auditioning for Drama School or University.



The workshop leader will lead students through a typical audition day using group improvisation exercises, monologue work, singing audition and interviews, whilst reinforcing the etiquette expected for professional training courses. The workshop will conclude with a mock audition, using role play scenarios that enable the students to be re-directed with their monologues or songs. Our trained workshop leaders will be able to advise students on the different options for training and the specific requirements of auditioning for acting and musical theatre courses. The workshop will also focus on raising aspiration and retraining negative mindsets, allowing students to participate in practical exercises that focus on overcoming nerves and anxiety. Choosing the right material is essential and the workshop leader will work with the students current monologue and song choices as well as introducing a new repertoire of audition material that meets the professional training requirements set out by drama schools and universities.



- Guidance on how to choose the right place to study with an introduction to the NEW Federation of Drama Schools which was established in June 2017 and the hallmarks of conservatoire style training.
- An honest perspective on the pros and cons between University and Drama School training and how to choose the right pathway to suit your own career goals.
- To give participants practical tips on how to prepare for the audition physically, vocally and emotionally in the lead up to the audition.
- Guidance on how to choose the right audition material for both professional courses in Acting & Musical Theatre (monologues & songs).
- What to expect in the audition and how to prepare for the day - positive mindsets and eliminating anxiety in the audition space.
- Audition etiquette and how to impress in your interview.

VOCAL HEALTH FOR PERFORMERS - THE HEALTHY VOICE

THE HEALTHY VOICE WORKSHOP

'The Healthy Voice' workshop has been designed to technically explore the mechanics of the voice, to enable students to understand how to improve vocal issues that may be preventing them from performing at their best in current performance work or exams. Public speaking both in a performance and professional capacity is essential and can sometimes hinder capable students who feel less confident about using their voice.

TEACHER FOCUS: This workshop will focus on how the voice works through a practical led workshop exploring the mechanics of the larynx, vocal folds, lung and diaphragm control as well as how to protect your voice through day to day Vocal Health exercises. As a teacher using your voice is key, our workshop leaders will show you how to to look after your instrument through busy and stressful teaching periods. No Singing required - unless you feel the urge!

STUDENT FOCUS: To enable students to improve vocal clarity and projection both for singing and acting work through vocal anatomy exercises. To help build students confidence with public speaking, preparing students for forthcoming performances, auditions, interviews and work placements that require clear and effective communication skills. All the exercises can be transferable in the classroom allowing less confident students to let their voice be heard!



YOGA FOR PERFORMERS

Almost all CDS Drama Schools provide yoga as a required class for first year students, with the expectation that they should carry on the practice throughout their training. But yoga not only improves strength & flexibility - it's a invaluable practice for physical awareness, posture & breath control which contributes to a grounded & confident performer.

This practical hour workshop is designed to help you & your students discover yoga in a safe and supportive environment, exploring the fundamentals of yoga with a focus on how it can enhance performance.

TEACHER FOCUS: Support personal wellbeing

The workshop will focus on basic yoga postures (asanas), safe alignment and breathing techniques (pranayama). We will also look at relaxation techniques (yoga nidra) and meditation. Regular yoga practice can also be a valuable tool for unleashing body-confidence, promoting mindfulness & raising self-esteem.

STUDENT FOCUS: Improve positive mindsets and physical development

Yoga can be used to help eliminate anxiety with low esteem students, relaxation, visualisation and mediation can also help to improve their self belief and attainment in class. Yoga also increases flexibility, posture, stability which can be transferable to all performance work.



VOCAL HEALTH FOR PERFORMERS

An educational workshop delivered by Stephen King, an International Vocal Coach, Massage and Laryngeal Manual Therapist on Harley Street in London.

Stephen has trained as a fully qualified deep tissue massage therapist and continued his studies with pioneering osteopath Jacob Lieberman, learning insightful techniques to free the voice through manual therapy. Stephen has also conducted his own post graduate research into the benefits and techniques of Vocal Massage and Laryngeal Manual Therapy, making him an expert in this field of work. Stephen also presented his research at the acclaimed 2018 Voice Geek conference in London and at The 2nd Edition World Voice Teacher's Expo in Poland. He is the resident vocal massage therapist within the cutting-edge treatment department at The Urdang Academy, using multidisciplinary techniques to effectively treat triple-threat performers and runs his own Harley Street clinic.
