Aliwal belonged to Lieutenant General Sir Harry Smith, a senior commander during the First Sikh War. The little Arab was named after Smith's victory at the Battle of Aliwal and proved to be Smith's best horse. He was Smith's only mount not to be sick, wounded or die during his military career. A remarkable feat considering that Aliwal travelled across Arabia to India, then to South Africa and later England during his years of service. He was also very obedient. A comrade recounted how Smith would ride Aliwal on troop inspections.

He would gallop at his men as if to charge them but without fail, Aliwal would stop suddenly very close to the troops! 'As a charger, he was incomparable, gallant and docile; as a friend, he was affectionate and faithful.'
