**Copenhagen was the Duke of Wellington's horse and served the Duke at most of his major battles, including Waterloo. Copenhagen was a superb battle horse. Unflinching amidst gunfire he repeatedly exhibited great stamina and fortitude. On one occasion he carried the General Duke into a square of infantrymen under cannon fire, both remaining perfectly composed. He became as famous as his master after the Napoleonic Wars as Copenhagen often attended parades and celebrations with the Duke on board. Hair was snipped from his tail and turned into jewellery. When the Duke became Prime Minister in 1828 he rode Copenhagen to Number 10 Downing Street.**
