

Sefton

Sefton became one of the first horses to be placed in the equestrian Hall of Fame

Sefton was a gallant Household Cavalry horse who served for seventeen years from 1967 to 1984. Surviving serious injuries during the terror attack in Hyde Park he recovered sufficiently to return to active service and was subsequently awarded "Horse of the Year" to a standing ovation as he took centre stage at the Horse of the Year show with his handler. Sefton became one of the first horses to be placed in the equestrian Hall of Fame with an annual award named after him. He became a beloved symbol of strength and determination and retired from the Household Cavalry in 1984
