So far this financial year, CHEER has helped elderly people with benefit claims of £204,000. We now have 29 friends who are visited regularly by our volunteers, plus 25 friends from the local community who we welcome to our Tea Parties

#### **Approved Provider Standard**

CHEER is currently undertaking the reaccreditation process for the NCVO Mentoring and Befriending Approved Provider Standard (APS).

APS is the national quality standard developed specifically for mentoring and befriending services and supports safe and effective practice in this field.

Renewed accreditation will ensure that the charity meets best practices and guidelines set out by the NCVO. There are 10 criteria which need to be met to ensure that an organisation such as CHEER operates a safe, effective and successful befriending scheme.

We are currently midway through this 12 month project, at the end of which we will undergo an assessment when we need to provide extensive examples and evidence of

how we manage our operations; testaments from friends and befrienders as to the benefits and quality of what we offer; how we monitor and assess our services.

We have also conducted initial consultations and communications with our volunteers who have welcomed the introduction.

Whilst this is a complex and detailed project to undertake, we believe it is

important that CHEER can demonstrate to all its stakeholders, including potential funders, that CHEER delivers its befriending service effectively, that we measure and assess the outcomes and that we seek to continuously improve our practices and services.

We are hoping that we will be able to report in our Spring 2018 newsletter that we have been successful in renewing this important accreditation.
