#### **New Focus on Social Isolation**

Recent research has shown that around 9 million people feel lonely and 200,000 people have not had a conversation with a friend or relative in more than two months.

This research underpins a recent government initiative to tackle loneliness launched in January. Newly appointed Minister for Loneliness, Tracey Crouch MP, has been tasked with

continuing to build on Jo Cox's campaign to tackle loneliness across all age groups and social classes.

The causes of loneliness in old age encompass bereavement, families moving away, money issues etc. These can accelerate deterioration of health, loss of mobility, a greater risk of cognitive decline, social isolation and depression.

CHEER welcomes the renewed focus on an issue which it has been helping to tackle in Elmbridge for over 60 years through befriending and laying on events such as tea parties and pie and pint lunches.

An hourly visit a week of one of our volunteers can make a huge difference to an isolated older person and we often hear comments such as "you made my day" or "you are the only person I have talked to for several

days".

Our volunteers are essential in helping us alleviate loneliness in the elderly in Elmbridge. We are always on the lookout for more volunteers, especially male befrienders as we have a number of older gentlemen who would prefer to be visited by a man.

#### **Rolling Back The Clock**

We often get asked why we are called CHEER and where did the Charity originate.

We began life as long ago as the early 1950s as the Esher and District Older People's Welfare Council, under the leadership of Noelle Shilson. Noelle remained active with CHEER throughout her long life, latterly as President (and a volunteer at the Claygate Centre) until shortly before she died at the age of 99 in 2012.

Over the years our activities have changed and evolved according to need and demand, with the new name CHEER being adopted in the early 1990s. The records show that at one time or another we have been involved in everything

from funding removal of wasps' nests to organising holiday excursions, fish and chip suppers, and cabaret nights. One thing that has never changed is our commitment to helping older people live full and comfortable lives for as long as possible in their own home. One tradition from our earliest days that still continues is the funding of the Christmas Day 'Meals on Wheels' lunch.

The latest major change in the way we operate came in 2010 when we first began to employ staff directly instead of on loan from Elmbridge Borough Council. This meant that we had to make our governance more robust by incorporating as a charitable company, with a modernised constitution (in our Articles of Association) reflecting best modern practice.

#### Friendships - Elsa and Bethanie

Elsa has lived in the area for 40 years and used to work in Further Education

Her daughters live in USA and Hong Kong. Elsa and her husband enjoyed visiting the USA to see the family. One of her grandchildren

has now moved back to study and work in the UK.

Bethanie is studying and working. She is enjoying the challenge of her first volunteering role and would encourage other young people to explore this option.
