As an Assistant Psychologist you will report to the Clinical Psychologist but would work closely with the C.A. Team, parents and other professionals. There are a number of roles available, both class and whole school based, and each role will include individual and group work with our children, carrying out assessments, devising and implementing behaviour support plans, monitoring and reporting on progress and participation in an extensive range of in-service training. It is envisaged that the candidates appointed will have the necessary skills, knowledge and experience to demonstrate good practice working with the schools wide and dynamic multi-disciplinary team. Some teaching responsibility may be involved.
