# **Sparklers Clinical Services**

Sparklers Foundation provides clinical services that are tailored to meet the unique needs of everyone with autism, other Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND), and related needs of their families. Services available include diagnostic evaluations to determine whether an individual has autism, another SEND or a combination of conditions. Support services are offered for individuals and their families through individual intervention services and support groups, parent mentors and parent teaching sessions. Sparklers provides education and training such as workshops for parents, teachers, and other professionals focusing on characteristics of SENDs and intervention strategies. Sparklers offers consultation services to programs such as schools, residential, organisations and healthcare communities serving individuals with autism and other SENDs.

#### **Initial Referral and Consultation**

An initial consultation is done either in person, over the phone or through a video session. The focus of this initial meeting is to discuss the family's needs and to direct the family to both appropriate Sparklers services as well as other available services in the community. The initial consultation is the first step to receive services.

## **Diagnostic Evaluation**

Our Clinical Centres provide diagnostic evaluations for children, adolescents, and adults who are thought to have autism and other SENDs but have not yet received a diagnosis. Evaluations typically consists of two visits to the clinic (varies depending upon complexity of case and services provided) and focus on issues of diagnosis and educational/Life coaching programming and intervention.

The evaluation includes caregiver interview; review of medical, social, academic, and developmental history; caregiver questionnaires, and testing sessions with the individual. The individual is directly assessed using state of the art, empirically-based assessment instruments including the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule (ADOS) and The Childhood Autism Rating Scale – 2nd edition (CARS2). Results of the evaluation are shared with the parents during an interpretive conference that is typically held at the end of the diagnostic day. An individualised, written evaluation summary with comprehensive recommendations and resources is mailed to the family.

Due to the needed participation of the parent(s) and the comprehensive nature of a diagnostic evaluation, siblings or other young children, besides the client being evaluated, are not permitted to come to the evaluation. Please make your own arrangements for childcare as our offices cannot provide childcare and children cannot be left unattended in the waiting rooms.

# **Parent Support and Education**

Sparklers provide parents an opportunity to meet and talk with other parents in a supportive setting. Workshops and teaching sessions focus on parent education and parent-professional collaboration. Focus of the education is on characteristics of autism and related conditions, and how it impacts communication, social development, behaviour management, and school services. Parents learn about their child's unique learning style and effective strategies that will enhance learning at home.

## Parent Lecture Series on Autism and Structured Strategies

Time limited information sessions for families provides an introduction to the learning styles of autism and other strategies.

#### Group Parent Teaching Sessions For "High Functional" Children with Autism

These sessions are available to parents of school age children and adolescents with autism who attend regular education classes or mainstream settings. These sessions include both group lecture and discussion for parents and individual and/or group meetings with the children and adolescents. Focus of training is on characteristics of autism/HFA and how it impacts communication, social development, behaviour management, and school services. Families are selected for group sessions based upon interest in group support services and individual needs.

#### **Intervention Services**

Staff at Sparklers Centres provide a range of intervention services for individuals with autism and other Special Educational Needs. Early intervention involves working with families and staff to increase a child's ability to function successfully and adaptively at home, in the community, and at school. Individual teaching and counselling sessions can focus on social skills, organisational and study skills, and emotional regulation. Parents may work together with clinicians to create effective programs for their child at home, at school and in the community

Interventions for Children - Sparklers Strategies for Toddlers

Sparklers Strategies for Toddlers (SSFT) is a comprehensive approach for toddlers with autism and their families, incorporating naturalistic, structured, and behavioural intervention strategies. Family Implemented Sparklers Strategies for Toddlers (SSFT) is our way of coaching parents to

- (a) understand how their toddler learns and
- (b) to use naturalistic and structured strategies to promote engagement. Interventionist conducts an initial Interview to determine treatment plan and broad goals for parents and child.

We provide this intervention through either:

Sparklers Strategies for Toddlers Weekly Sessions

Weekly Sparklers Strategies for Toddlers sessions are focused on parental goals.

## • Sparklers Strategies for Toddlers Intensive Session

Intensive sessions target individualised treatment goals for the child and parent/carer. Data is collected to measure progress. Group and/or individual sessions may be provided. Regular supervision required.

## **Interventions for School Aged Children**

## Individual Parent-Child Teaching Sessions

#### **Interventions for Adults**

The sessions program is short-term (4 to 6 sessions) and goal directed. It is not psychotherapy or a replacement for psychotherapy. This program is useful for independent adults who are motivated to discuss and work on goals for themselves.
