Dear Ambassadors,

It has been some time since we issued our last AAN newsletter so one of my New Year resolutions is that we communicate to the wider Network on a more regular basis. COVID has not halted our work. Advocacy for apprenticeships is needed more than ever. The Government's decision to make skills a central feature of its 'Plan for Jobs' shows that apprenticeships are playing a catalytic role; in both driving the economic recovery and giving individuals the opportunities to progress in their careers.



I am also aware of how many Ambassadors have joined webinars with the ESFA policy teams to explore how the skills incentives are landing with businesses and young people – and how they can be

New Year Honours



I want to offer my warmest congratulations to **Neil Weller, Chair, London AAN** on his award of an MBE in The Queen's New Year Honours list for his remarkable services to education and skills.

Neil has successfully championed apprenticeship opportunities working at Troup Bywaters & Anders; culminating in securing the prestigious SME Employer of the Year title in the National Apprenticeship Awards twice in the last 3 years - which is an absolutely incredible achievement.

He has displayed considerable enthusiasm, drive, and knowledge as Chair of the London Apprenticeship Ambassador Network since March 2017; engaging new members and making great strides in integrating

the Young Ambassadors into 'one' Network. This award is fitting recognition for Neil's overwhelming commitment to apprenticeships for employers and young people.

In addition, our **Cambridgeshire and Peterborough AAN Chair Stuart Gibbons** received an OBE for his impressive services to international trade as Managing Director of Le Mark Group. New Vice-Chair



I am delighted to confirm that **Lieutenant Colonel Ingrid Hall OBE AGC (ETS)** from the Ministry of Defence has secured the role as Vice-Chair of our Network.

Ingrid replaces Kathryn Porter who relinquished the position in December.

Ingrid has over 30 years experience in the Armed Forces and now leads its impressive and award-winning apprenticeship programme.

The British Army gained top spot in the Top 100 Apprenticeship Employers by helping over 8,000 apprentices gain new skills and progress in 2019-2020; with almost a fifth of its workforce currently completing apprenticeship programmes as part of their military training – in areas including engineering, telecommunications, logistics, construction, health and IT.

The Royal Navy achieved third place in the list; the Royal Air Force was tenth.

It's a real coup for the Network to have Ingrid as our Vice-Chair; her leadership, her commitment to social mobility and young people, as well as her desire to ensure we support employers of all sizes during these challenging times, will be invaluable.
