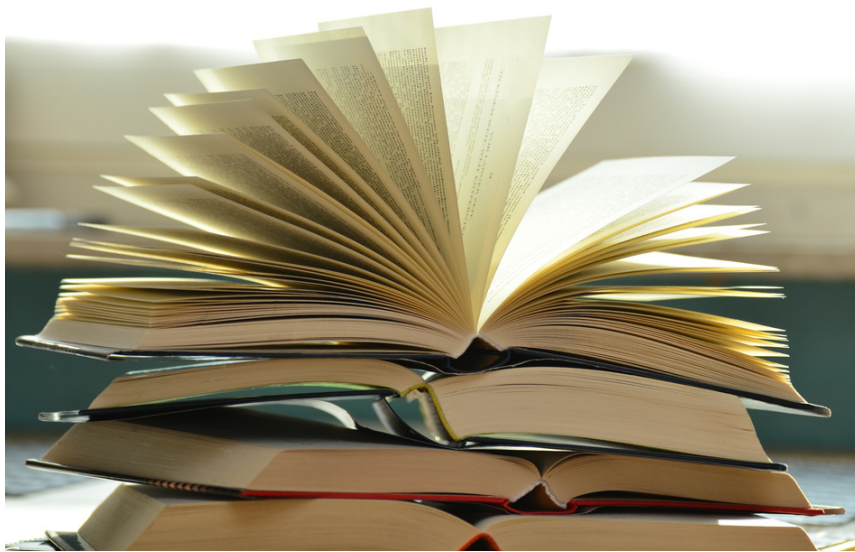

Funding for Trainee Nursing Associates confirmation 2023

Trainee Nursing Associate – Standard offer

For each TNA, an employer will be eligible for a total funding sum of £8,000 over two years (£4,000 per year).



Trainee Nursing Associates - Learning Disability offer

For trainees that are working at least 50% of their clinical practice time with people who have a learning disability or/and are autistic, an employer will be eligible for a total funding sum of £15,800 over two years (£7,900 per year) *.

Tier 2 visa sponsor

This is for PMs or Practice Leadership Teams. Webinar to be presented by Sharon Lee from the Kent Training Hub. The webinar will also be recorded for access on demand afterwards.

Becoming a Tier 2 visa sponsor employer can open up recruitment pools of staff significantly as more staff coming to the primary care medical workforce are international graduates. The process is very simple, and this is a walk-through guide, with opportunity to ask questions.

Spotlight on: Alexandria Dyer, Workforce Development Lead

1. What does your job involve?

My role in the Training Hub is Workforce Development Lead for Primary Care Workforce and supporting Surrey Downs. My role is primarily to provide education and training needs and requirements that creates support and ensures the knowledge, skills and abilities of our staff to perform at their optimal level of professionalism.

2. How long have you worked in the NHS/Training Hub.
