What is a DPP? A Designated Prescribing Practitioner (DPP) is a workplace-based supervisor who supports the pharmacist in the experiential part of the prescribing course (called Learning in Practice). The role of a DPP is to oversee, support and assess the competence of Independent Prescribing trainees, in collaboration with academic and workplace partners, during the period of learning in practice. ANYONE in practice can be an Infection Prevention Control Lead. Please consider this important role which links directly to the <u>CQC Quality Standard</u>. NHSE have also developed an <u>Education Framework</u> for the role which supports the necessary training and support required.

The recommended training for IPC Leads is to complete <u>Skills for Health modules 1&2</u>. Each module costs £12 and you can reclaim via our <u>CPD Application Process</u>.
