A Designated Prescribing Practitioner (DPP) is a workplace-based supervisor who supports the pharmacist in the experiential part of the prescribing course (called Learning in Practice). The role of a DPP is to oversee, support and assess the competence of Independent Prescribing trainees, in collaboration with academic and workplace partners, during the period of learning in practice. 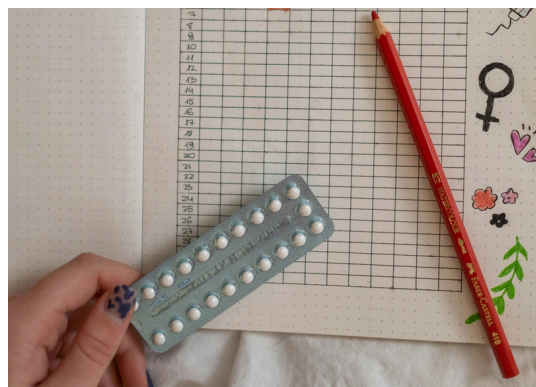

GPA Programme

September 2024 Cohort

GPA's support administration and basic clinical duties enabling the GP to focus on the patient.

GPA: The GPA accredited programme is open to existing staff in roles such as: receptionists, phlebotomists, secretaries, health care assistants and administrators. Find out how to apply for the September cohort here: <https://www.surreytraininghub.co.uk/general-practice-assistant#gsc.tab=0>

Upon completion of all five domains, the GPA will be awarded with a certificate 'GP Assistant Skills Certificate' which is equivalent to 10 credits at a Level 4 Completed in 6 months. The accredited GPA programme is based on the GPA framework, and you will work through the competencies within the framework, which covers five domains, 2 clinical, and 3 non clinical. The learner will work through each domain via an online ePortfolio, which is then signed off by their GP mentor and verified.

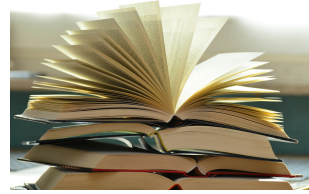
