

Inviting New Graduates and Internationally Qualified Healthcare Staff new to the UK to Join us in Schwartz Rounds 2023/24

## Rounds at the University of Surrey

University of Surrey has been running Schwartz Rounds since **2019** as a **facilitated peer support space** for students, and we would now like to invite newly qualified NHS staff (who may have graduated from Surrey or elsewhere) and those new to the NMC/HCPC Register, in to our Rounds. Rounds run monthly (mostly online) and provide a safe psychological space to **process emotions** and **reduce feelings of isolation** when facing difficulties in practice, facilitate reflective practice and improve wellbeing and retention.

As you transition to being a newly qualified professional, the Rounds at the University of Surrey are available to you, to help you bridge the gap between your student and practitioner identities. Our Rounds are also available to any internationally qualified staff who have started working in the UK within the last two years.
